Community Art Meets Ecology

This spring, the UVa Arts Board and the UVa Art Museum will sponsor visiting artist Alberto Rey and his “Local Species” Project. “Local Species” documents endangered fish and investigates the relation of ecosystems to local culture – humans being another local species.

Young artists will first explore the ecology of rivers and streams. They will then create collaborative book projects that incorporate writing, drawing, linoleum block cutting and printing, hand coloring, and book-binding.
